- 3. **Exhibition:** The completed artworks are showcased in an exhibition where participants and the public can view, appreciate, and celebrate the artistic expressions and stories behind each piece.

Why Brushes with Cancer?

- **Empowerment: ** Provides a platform for individuals touched by cancer to express themselves creatively and share their stories.
- **Community Building: ** Fosters connections and support networks between individuals impacted by cancer and the artistic community.
- **Awareness: ** Raises awareness about the diverse experiences of those affected by cancer and the power of art as a form of healing and communication.
